

Suggested Timeline This plan creates a 2 hour meeting

10 minutes... opening prayer as a group- pray the appropriate hour for your meeting or use our prayer book as a guide (provided separately)

(If you have very young children in your group, this is the best time for them to break out & work on their sensory play, listen to story books & sing together. Older children can participate in educational time. Everyone regroups for snack!)

10 minutes... read the Gospel for the upcoming Sunday & complete the corresponding puzzle from page 12 or 13 together.

10 minutes...Present the icon lesson from page 3, be sure to print copies of the icon for each child to see as you instruct.

10 minutes... Prepare for the Nativity services and study your scriptures on pages 6 & 7..

20 minutes...Snack time (see below)

25 minutes...Use the instructions on page 10 to make a salt dough gift for the children to give away.

25 minutes...Use the instructions on page 10 to make a memorial ornament of their favorite gifts and memories from the 2024 year.

10 minutes...Closing prayer

Expand your meeting Get everyone moving!

St. Lucy's Feast Day is December 13th. She lived in Italy about 300 years after Christ and was martyred for her faith. One story tells that she wore a wreath of candles on her head to keep her hands free to carry a basket of bread to Christians who were in prison. The candles served to light her way as she



navigated the bumpy roads of her home town in the middle of the night.



In her memory, we can have a St. Lucy's Day parade! All the children can dress in white robes (or dad's undershirts!).

Girls can wear a candle wreath on their heads made from felt or construction paper and a red sash around their waist. Boys can make a "star boy" hat from a paper cone. Then, take to the aisles



of your social hall or the streets of your neighborhood, sharing songs and sweet rolls with all who you encounter!

SNACK TIME!

A simple and allergen friendly snack this month is to make a Christmas tree out of fruits and veggies! You can add cheese cut into star shapes for a tree topper and pretzel sticks as a trunk. Dips such as hummus or ranch dressing in portion cups makes for easy serving for the children.
